

Jim Flaherty, SJ was born in Chicago, IL in 1956. He spent the majority of his youth, however, in Milwaukee, WI. Jim graduated from Marquette High School in 1974 and Marquette University in 1978. He entered the Society of Jesus in 1979 and, after completing his theology studies at the Jesuit School of Theology at Berkeley, he was ordained a priest in 1992.

After ordination, Jim served as associate pastor at St. Patrick's Parish in Milwaukee (1992-93) and as assistant director of Campus Ministry at Marquette University (1993-94). He completed his master's and doctoral degrees in philosophy at the New School for Social Research in New York

City, from 1994 to 2003. He has taught in the Philosophy Department at Marquette University since 2003, served several years as rector of the Jesuit Community at Marquette, and now serves as pastor of Gesu Parish in Milwaukee. Jim currently is a member of the Board of Trustees at Marquette University and Santa Clara University.

He has preached numerous retreats at Oshkosh, Demontreville (Lake Elmo, MN), and Barrington, IL, in addition to directing many eight-day, individually directed retreats since his ordination.
